Winterton House Nursery offers fully funded early education places for 2, 3 & 4 year olds. Eligible families will be able to get 15 hours of free high quality early years care and education each week.

Fee paying places are available for children who may not yet be eligible for the early years education funding, please contact the nursery for further details.

EARLY EDUCATION FUNDED PLACES FOR 2 YEAR OLDS



Some families will be entitled to access 15 hours a week of nursery education funding for **2 year olds**. You may be eligible if you are claiming one of the following:

- Universal Credit - if you and your partner are on a low income from work (this usually means a combined income of less than £15,400 a year after tax)
 - Income Support or income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
 - income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
 - tax credits and you have an annual income of under £16,190 before tax
 - the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
 - support through part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act
 - the Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (the payment you get when you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- OR
- they are looked after by a local council
 - they have a current statement of special education needs (SEN) or an education health and care (EHC) plan
 - they get Disability Living Allowance
 - they have left care under a special guardianship order, child arrangements order or adoption order



EARLY EDUCATION FUNDED PLACES FOR 3 AND 4 YEAR OLDS



All 3 and 4-year olds in England are entitled to 15 hours of free early education each week and children become eligible for early education funding the term after their third birthday. You just need to complete the nursery registration form and provide us with a copy of your child's birth certificate.

Fully funded places for 2, 3 and 4 year olds
